# **RESEARCH CORNER**

Dr. Sharon Miller has received an award from the American Auditory Society for her paper: Neural Correlates of Phonetic Categorization in Adult Cochlear Implant Listeners. Dr. Miller presented this work at the recent American Auditory Society meeting in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Drs. Chhayakant Patro and Pavel Zahorik continue their work on reverberant sound. Although speech understanding difficulties in reverberation are frequently reported by individuals with hearing loss, reverberation can also provide important sound quality benefits, such as enjoying music in a concert hall. Drs. Patro and Zahorik are studying both the positive and negative aspects of reverberation. One part of the study is focused specifically on prototype hearing aids that may improve listening in reverberation. Another part of the study is focused more broadly on perceptual aspects of reverberation.

Over the last two years Claire Miller – now Sterling – has worked at the Heuser Hearing Clinic as an Audiometric Assistant specializing in cochlear implants and pediatric patient care. She also helps with the audiology needs of the students of the Hearing & Language Academy. Previously she was a classroom assistant for five years as an employee of Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS). "I love working with the kids at the school and helping them reach their academic

goals by making sure they have the best access to sound in their classroom environment at all times," says Claire.

Claire sees hearing healthcare quickly evolving. "The technology in hearing

healthcare makes such great advances on an almost daily basis that it is exciting to help adults and children to get both great access to sound and to integrate new hearing technologies into their daily lifestyle with the use of accessories, smart phone apps, or just showing someone a new feature in their current technology," says Claire. She also helps with the many outreach projects including HHI's biggest outreach of the year, the Kentucky State Fair booth, and the ListenUp! Project. Claire successfully manages the community outreach and the organization of all the booth volunteers for the entire weeks of the fair. "Having a booth at the state fair allows Heuser to provide hearing screens to thousands of people and gives up-to-date information that closes the gap between patients knowing about their hearing loss and actually getting patients the help they need to manage," adds Claire.

When she's not at HHI, Claire spends time with her husband, Christopher, and her family - especially nieces, Grace and Ruby. Grace attended HHLA, in the Hearing Peers class and, according to Claire, still fondly reminisces about her experience there. Claire's hobbies include watching college basketball (she admits to being a bit of a crazy basketball fan in love with the Kentucky Wildcats) and arts and crafts.
