FOODS THAT PROMOTE HEALTHY HEARING

We've all heard the saying, "An apple a day keeps the doctor away..." Or, eat carrots for better eye sight? But did you know that there are also foods you can eat to benefit your ears? Researchers have discovered that there are many foods that promote healthy hearing.

Age, infections and noise are among the causes of hearing impairment. Constant exposure to loud music can also impact your hearing. According to The National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders (NIDCD), exposure to high decibel noise can stimulate damaging free radicals to cause the destruction of sensitive inner ear hair cells. You can reduce this damage by adding foods with folic acid and antioxidants. Foods loaded with these are eggs, spinach, asparagus and nuts. Also dark chocolate and oysters are beneficial to hearing health because they contain zinc and a lack of zinc in the body has been connected to age-related hearing loss.

Other beneficial foods are potatoes, artichokes and bananas that are rich in magnesium and can help protect the hearing of people who work in intense noise settings. Additionally, fish such as salmon or trout contain Vitamin D and Omega 3 fats that can help reduce age-related hearing problems. And, foods such as tuna and anchovies can help you hear better in your later years.
